His behavior with his fellow Frenchmen does not help further his desire for romance with the beautiful Margot. She prefers dashing, but fickle, Captain Paul Fontaine.

Pierre has no choice but to go to Margot in his other identity, the notorious Red Shadow, and carry her off to his desert camp. Complications arise when Azuri, a dancing girl, reveals the camp's location to the French.

Upder the Lights and Behind the Scenes

Stephanie Brigham (Chorus) is happy to be reconnecting with VLOC after the untimely death of her husband Gordon. This is the group in which they met and subsequently performed in many shows together. She has two daughters and teaches first grade.

Ed Byrdy (Lt. Lavergne) has been in the chorus of nearly all of the G&S operas several times. He steps out of the chorus for a brief cameo role after which he vanishes back into the chorus like a red shadow.

Elaine Dalbo (Clementina) marks her third VLOC production with *Desert Song*, following *Iolanthe* (Iolanthe) and *Pinafore* (Buttercup). Upcoming engagements include WS and OBC and when not performing, this Buffalo native spends her days toiling as a press secretary for a Member of Congress.

Kiersten Drumm (Special Girl) was last "seen" with VLOC as assistant stage manager for *Magic Flute*. Recently, she was found tripping as Leila in WS's *Iolanthe* and as a punk 16-year old boy (Cherubino) in FOC's *Marriage of Figaro*.

Blair Eig (Ali Ben Ali) has appeared in eight productions with VLOC, including performances as Spokesman in *Magic Flute*, Sergeant of Police in *Pirates*, and the title role in *Mikado*. He has logged over 20 productions with WS and was most recently was seen in FOC's inaugural production of *Marriage of Figaro* (as Bartolo and Antonio). When not singing, Dr. Blair is Chief Medical Officer at Holy Cross Hospital in Silver Spring.

Ayun Fedorcha (Lighting Designer) is delighted to return to VLOC, where she has previously lit *Pinafore*, *Pirates*, *The Zoo & Trial by Jury*, *Patience*, *Mikado*, *Ruddigore*, *Die Fledermaus*, and *Merry Widow*. She freelances in the metro DC area, and is a member of the United Scenic Artist union - local 829.

Fran Fleming (Chorus) has been performing in G&S operas for over 30 years, as a charter member of WS and later when VLOC was established. She is enjoying singing a non-G&S opera and especially appreciates having fewer rehearsals.

Lisa Freese (Edith/Special Girl) continues to enjoy her association with VLOC that has lasted more than 10 years. Previous roles include Eliza, *The Zoo*; Sally, *Die Fledermaus*; Celia, *Iolanthe*; Peep-Bo, *Mikado* with VLOC. When not onstage, backstage, or in the planning stages, she spends her time with her wonderful husband and almost 3-year old son, both of whom are great 'performers,' though not usually in public. Thanks to Denise, Gaye, and Leta!

Michael Galizia (Pierre/The Red Shadow) was Figaro in FOC's inaugural production of Marriage of Figaro. This is his seventh show with VLOC. Previous appearances are: Gondoliers (Guiseppe), Trial (the Learned Judge), Pirates (Major-General Stanley), Iolanthe (Lord Chancellor), Magic Flute (Papageno), Pinafore (Dick Deadeye); with WS he has performed in Gondoliers (Don Alahambra), Mikado (Pooh-Bah), Yeomen (Wilfred Shadbolt) and Iolanthe (Lord Chancellor).

Rachael Goldman (Susan) is very excited to do another show with VLOC. Rachael has appeared in VLOC's *The Magic Flute*, as the Second Lady, *La Vie Parisienne*, as Pauline, and in *Gondoliers* in the chorus. She has also appeared in MTA's *State Fair* as Emily. Rachael is thrilled to play the role of Susan opposite her husband, Bennie.

Richard Gorbutt (Bennie Kidd) is pleased once again to be allowed to do what he does best, playing the idiot. In his seventh show for VLOC, he is chuffed to bits in being allowed to work again with a talented team and despite being resident in the states for over four years, he still hates root beer. Thanks to Rachael for her love and support and advice on hitting those high notes.

Ira Haber (General Birabeau) has lost count of the number of VLOC shows he has been in, but thinks the number is in the upper teens. Most recently, he was seen on stage as Lord Mountararat in *Iolanthe*, and not seen (he hopes) as

Paul McIvaine (Sid El Kar) last appeared with VLOC as Eisenstein in *Die Fledermaus* – a role he reprised with AC&O. Earlier this year, he performed as Alfred in the Eldbrooke Artist Series production of *Die Fledermaus*. His Musical Theater credits include Sir Harry in *Once Upon a Mattress* with TAP; Alexius in *The Chocolate Soldier* and *Shakespeare: A Vaudeville* with MVP; and Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol* at the AT in McLean.
