The Story of the Opera

Colonel Fairfax is under sentence of death because an unscrupulous relative has preferred a charge of sorcery against him in order to inherit the fortune which comes to him should Fairfax die unmarried. Fortunately, the Colonel has two friends in the Tower: the Lieutentant in charge and Sergeant Meryll of the Guards (as well as Meryll's daughter Phoebe, who loves the Colonel from afar). Meryll's son, Leonard, has been appointed a Yeoman, and his father plans to keep him in hiding, release Fairfax, and introduce him among the Yeomen as Leonard. Meanwhile, Fairfax has explained the reason for his predicament to the Lieutenant, who undertakes to find him a wife in a hurry so that the kinsman may be thwarted.

Jack Point and Elsie Maynard, two strolling players, arrive at the Tower and the Lieutenant induces her to agree to a marry Fairfax by the offer of money, badly needed for Elsie's sick mother. Point plans to marry Elsie himself, but, on being assured that the bridegroom will certainly be dead within the hour, agrees to the plan, and is appointed Lieutenant's Jester.

Phoebe steals the cell keys from Wilfred, the head jailor, and Fairfax is dressed as a Yeoman. All is ready for the execution when it is discovered that Fairfax has escaped! Jack Point is in despair and Elsie faints in the arms of Fairfax.

Elsie has been nursed back to health by Dame Carruthers, who reveals that the girl talks in her sleep, revealing her secret marriage to Fairfax (who is still disguised as Leonard). Point concocts a scheme with Wilfred to free Elsie from Fairfax: Wilfred will fire a shot, claiming to have killed the escaping prisoner as he tried to swim the river. This done, the citizens hail Wilfred as a hero.

Point proposes to Elise, but Fairfax steps in and carries her off. Wilfred learns the truth from Pheobe and blackmails her into agreeing to marry him. Dame Carruthers has overheard this and, in turn, captures Sgt. Merryl on the same terms. At Elsie's wedding to "Leonard" the reprieve arrives for Fairfax. Elsie is distraught but Fairfax reveals himself to her and all is set for a happy ending when the disconsolate Point arrives and the curtain falls on his sorrow amid the merriment of the crowd.

Glossary

(Courtesy of the Gilbert & Sullivan Very Light Opera Company)

(in order of occurrence)

Act I:

Yeomen of the Guard (Tower Warders) - Gilbert is guilty of some inaccuracies when he used these terms interchangeably, The *Yeomen of the Guard* were established by Henry VII in 1485 to serve as the Sovereign's personal bodyguard. The *Yeomen Warders* were set up in 1548 as guards (and now also serve as tour guides) of the tower. Popularly known as "Beefeaters," they are selected from non-commissioned officers and warrant officers on the basis of merit.

The Little Ease - a Tower dungeon cell, a cube about 4 feet per side, where one could not stand or lie in comfort.

<u>Beauchamp Tower</u> - (pronounced "beecham") - often used as a lodging for prisoners of rank.

<u>Old Blunderbore</u> - the giant in the story "Jack and the Giant Killer" who grinds men's bones to make his bread.

Is life a boon? ... I have a boon to beg - a favor.

a hundred \underline{crowns} - about £25 - more than a laborer might earn in a year.

give us quip and quiddity - witty remark and trifling point.

buy an <u>electuary</u> for her - a medicinal preparation made with sugar and honey.

He who'd make his fellow creatures wise should always gild the philosophic pill - same sentiment as "a spoonful of sugar makes the medicine go down."

The consequences fell no mortal can foretell - dire, evil.

a thousand *marks* - about £666 (more than 6 years' salary for the well-paid Lieutenant!).

Under the Lights and Behind the Scenes

Rick DuPuy (Yeoman), in the autumn of his life (= 24), here at rest in ample clover (= childhood home), rejoices in telling over his impetuous May and June (= don't ask about his year teaching middle-schoolers Latin unless you REALLY want to hear about it).

Blair Eig (Wilfred) has appeared in 9 productions with VLOC, including performances as Ali Ben Ali in *Desert Song*, Spokesman in *Magic Flute*, Sergeant of Police in *Pirates*, and the title role in *Mikado*. He has logged over 20 productions with WS, including appearing as the Usher in this season's *Trial by Jury*. Last summer, Blair was seen in the dual role of Bartolo and Antonio in FOC's inaugural production of *Marriage of Figaro*. When not singing, Dr. Blair is Chief Medical Officer at Holy Cross Hospital in Silver Spring.

Ayun Fedorcha (Lighting Designer) is delighted to return to VLOC, where she has previously lit *Pinafore*, *Pirates*, *The Zoo & Trial by Jury*, *Patience*, *Mikado*, *Ruddigore*, *Die Fledermaus*, and *Merry Widow*. 
